Bantock is a two-form, diverse community school situated in inner-city Wolverhampton, with over 40 languages and 70% EAL, making it a vibrant and stimulating place. It is ranked in the lowest 6% nationally for deprivation, 48% mobility and with 64% pupils identified as disadvantaged.
