

What does Digital Safeguarding look like at Bantock Primary School?

Weekly Safeguarding updates including on staff meeting agendas.

Annual training for all staff as part of annual Safeguarding CPD with support from external agencies.

Filtering for devices within school as well as school loaned devices.

Monitoring of use of devices with Technology Manager responsible for violations.

Digital Safeguarding curriculum mapped to PDR and Computing planning.

Opportunities across the curriculum for reinforcement including an English unit of work for each year group.

Digital Safeguarding Policy Shared and Discussed annually.

Annual Digital Safeguarding training for Governors with updates shared.

School Website has information for parents along with signposting links for further support which includes CEOP and Reporting Harmful Content.

Half termly newsletter shares Digital Safeguarding information, tips in response to pupil survey or incidents.

ProjectEVOLVE resources and Education for a Connected World statements used to assess pupils understanding.

Regular assemblies delivered by staff and pupils.

Acceptable use policy agreed by staff, governors, volunteers, visitors and pupils.

Technology Manager is Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead. Link Governor Responsible for Safeguarding.

Parent Workshops including the Digital Protector course and information on Parents Evening

Parents invited to join the Online Safety group with pupils, staff, Technology lead and Governor to develop practise in school

Digital 5 a Day are displayed and reinforced regularly.

Year 5 and 6 complete annual Online Safety Survey which informs the structure of curriculum delivery.

Rigid recording and reporting procedures in place for staff concerns.

Displays around school to promote Digital Safeguarding.

Digital Ambassadors selected each year in Year 5 and 6 to receive external training in supporting other pupils with online safety concerns.

Digital Ambassadors create content for pupils and parents.
